Randolph to fundraise for his ministry's clinics in Haiti

Tim Randolph spent Wednesday trying to call and e-mail all seven of his ministry's medical clinics in and around Port-au-Prince after the most powerful earthquake ever recorded in Haiti decimated parts of the island nation Tuesday.

As president of Randolph World Ministries Inc. in Collinsville, Ill., he has helped build and run more than 20 health clinics throughout the Caribbean nation.

Randolph, an

associate professor

of clinical laboratory science at Saint Louis University, had just flown out of Port-au-Prince Monday after three weeks in Haiti working on his ministry, including pursuing plans to build an eighth clinic outside the capital city.

Right now, those plans are on hold as Randolph tries to account for all 300 of his ministry's clinic workers. He's launching a fundraising campaign to send medical kits, surgical supplies and other items to the damaged clinics, which will have to rebuild and work overtime to help the wounded. Some 3 million people are injured or homeless, according to the Red Cross.

"I'm thinking about my ministry partners and all the devastation this country has endured the past two years with the hurricane, earthquake and flooding," he said. "I don't know how much one country can take."

Randolph said he's hopeful that recent changes in government leaders and infrastructure will make it easier for humanitarian aid to reach victims instead of getting caught in a web of corrupt off cials as in years' past.

Randolph said he plans to set up a PayPal account for his ministry's fundraising effort at his ministry's Web site.
